## Questions

1. Baptism is a sign of burial and resurrection. Christians daily deny and put to death the works of the flesh and allow God's new life to shine through.

What does God say to the person who feels powerless to overcome, unable to be good enough?

2. People still need salvation. For all the advances in wealth, knowledge and technology; kingdoms and civilizations rise up, wage wars, come and go. People in the world are basically the same now as they ever were: in need of salvation, reconciliation with God, transformation.

Do we still think that the 'rich' are more right and in less need of salvation than the poor though?

3. Jesus' resurrection was an event that could only be made sense of if Jesus was who he said he was. It was totally unexpected after such a brutally horrific execution as a Roman flogging and crucifixion. The leaders of the day desperately tried to cover it up but failed.

How can we answer someone who still denies that Jesus rose from the dead?
