

Abi spoke to us about Esther's extraordinary courage and faith, which resulted in the salvation of her people, the Jews in exile, and that showed:

- God's faithfulness and love to His people to continue his historic promises to their forbearers.
- That God's favour is with purpose.
- Faithful, sacrificial obedience in reliance upon God furthers His will upon the earth.
- The spiritual battle where the Jews fasted and prayed is at least as real as the physical or practical battle.
